- 1 (a) Outline and explain how “enacted prophecy” in the work of Jeremiah caused offence to and hostility from the people. [30]
- (b) Critically evaluate the claim that the prophets were always outspoken in their criticism of worship. [20]
- 2 (a) “Deutero-Isaiah offered an explanation for the suffering of the exiles.”
With particular reference to this quotation, explain the teaching of Deutero-Isaiah in the Suffering Servant Songs. [30]
- (b) Critically assess the view that Second Isaiah’s description of Cyrus as God’s “shepherd” led to questions on the nature of God’s sovereignty. [20]
- 3 (a) Examine the purpose and nature of the reforms put in place by Nehemiah. [30]
- (b) Critically evaluate the claim that the actions of Nehemiah have little relevance for contemporary society. [20]
- 4 (a) Identify and consider the criticisms of the “Shepherds of Israel” by the prophet Ezekiel. [30]
- (b) Critically assess the claim that Ezekiel’s message has valuable lessons for leaders today. [20]
