Assessment Arrangements for candidates completing in 2021

- 1. For candidates wishing to cash-in for an Entry Level qualification in March 2021, CCEA will require a reduced number of units for moderation as follows:
 - Centre delivers, enters and submits levels for 6 units as detailed in the specification. This may include work completed prior to 2020-21.
 - CCEA will moderate **3 of these units** selected by the centre at the time of moderation.
 - Units that have been previously awarded at unit level without a cash-in at qualification level will count towards the number of units required for moderation in March 2021.
 - The Entry Level qualification award will be based on all 6 units.
- 2. Unit level awards will still be available and moderated in the normal way.
