<p>Component 3: Individual Performances in Physical Activities and Sports</p>	<p>Controlled assessment</p> <p>a) Students are assessed on the consistent quality, efficiency and effectiveness of their performances in physical activities and/or sports.</p> <p>Students perform three physical activities and/or sports from the list that we supply.</p> <p>For one physical activity or sport, the assessment may be based on the consistent quality, efficiency and effectiveness of the student's performance as an event manager.</p> <p>3 × 50 = 150 marks</p> <p>and</p> <p>b) Students are assessed on the consistent quality of their analysis and evaluation of their own and others' performances.</p> <p>50 marks</p>	<p>50%</p>	<p>Component 3a: Reduce practical performances from three to two. Students perform two physical activities and/or sports</p> <p>Component 3b: Audio recordings of student analysis and evaluation will be required for moderation.</p>

For those students who started their GCSE course in September 2020 and are due to cash in the full GCSE in Summer 2022, should they choose to sit all components of the GCSE, they will receive the higher of either:

- the grade awarded on the basis of the outcome of the required components specified by CCEA; or
- the grade awarded on the basis of the outcome of the full set of components for that qualification.

In both cases the full specification content should still be delivered.

For candidates commencing their GCSE course in September 2021 it is recommended that, as far as possible, the components are delivered in numerical order in case of any further disruption to the academic year.
