To apply, **you must:**

- have the ability to mark and moderate written assessments in your subject specialism through the medium of Irish

AND be

- **a fully qualified post-primary teacher** with a degree in the subject specialism being examined

OR

- **a fully qualified primary teacher** who can demonstrate appropriate subject knowledge in the specialism being examined

OR

- **a higher education student in your final year of teacher training college** with a degree in the subject specialism being examined.

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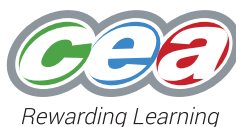

INTRODUCTION

WHY EXAMINE WITH CCEA?
