



Privacy Notice – CCEA Staff

Who are we?

The Council for the Curriculum, Examinations and Assessment (“CCEA”) is a "controller" in relation to personal data. CCEA is a legal entity (“CCEA”, “we” “us”) which includes CCEA Regulation.

What is the purpose of this document?

This Privacy Notice is for CCEA Staff.

We are responsible for deciding how we hold and use personal information about you. This document provides you with certain information that must be provided under the UK General Data Protection Regulation (UK GDPR).

Data protection principles

We will comply with data protection law and principles, which means that your data will be:

- Used lawfully, fairly and in a transparent way.
- Collected only for valid purposes that we have clearly explained to you and not used in any way that is incompatible with those purposes.
- Relevant to the purposes we have told you about and limited only to those purposes.
- Accurate and kept up to date.
- Kept only as long as necessary for the purposes we have told you about.
- Kept securely.

The kind of information we hold about you

We process personal data relating to those we employ. We do this for employment purposes, to assist in the running of the business and to enable individuals to be paid.

The personal data may include the following:

- Name
- Date of birth
- Staff number
- Address
- Telephone/mobile numbers
- Email address
- National insurance number
- Bank details, pension information and payment records
- Next of kin and GP contact details
- Performance information
- Training and Attendance information
- Medical records
- Equality information (Section 75 Equality Monitoring data)
- Complaints, investigations and disciplinary information
- Conflicts of interest
- Trade union membership (where appropriate)
- Photographs (for staff ID)
- CCTV footage (CCEA buildings and any buildings used by CCEA for business purposes)

How is your personal information collected?

We collect data directly from you when you successfully join CCEA. We will not disclose it to anyone else unless we are required to by law. For example, we may share information with the Equality.

How and why we use your personal data

Under data protection law, we can only use your personal data if we have a proper reason, eg:

- where you have given consent;
- to comply with our legal and regulatory obligations;
- for the performance of a contract with you or to take steps at your request before entering into a contract;
- for us to perform a task in the public interest or for our official functions; or
- for our legitimate interests or those of a third party.

A legitimate interest is when we have a business or commercial reason to use your personal data, so long as this is not overridden by your own rights and interests. We will carry out an assessment when relying on legitimate interests, to balance our interests against your own.

The table below explains what we use your personal data for and why.

Automated decision-making

You will not be subject to decisions that will have a significant impact on you based solely on automated decision-making.

Data sharing

Why might you share my personal information with third parties?

CCEA will not share information about you with third parties without your consent unless the law allows or requires us to. We are required to share some of your personal data with:

- The Department of Education and the Department for the Economy
- His Majesty's Revenue and Customs
- Education Authority
- Pensions and Benefits Providers

International Transfers

We will not share your personal information with anyone outside the United Kingdom.

Data security

We have put in place appropriate security measures to prevent your personal information from being accidentally lost, used or accessed in an unauthorised way, altered or disclosed. In addition, we limit access to your personal information to those employees, contractors and other third parties who have a legitimate business requirement. They will only process your personal information on our instructions and they are subject to a duty of confidentiality.

We have put in place procedures to deal with any suspected data security incident/breach and will notify you and any applicable regulator of a suspected breach where we are legally required to do so.

Data retention

How long will you use my information for?

We will keep personal data only for as long as necessary to fulfil the purposes for which we are processing your personal information unless the law permits or requires longer. Personal Information – Your Rights

Under certain circumstances, by law you have the right to:

- **Request access** to your personal information (commonly known as a "data subject access request"). This enables you to receive a copy of the personal information we hold about you and to check that we are lawfully processing it.
- **Request correction** of the personal information that we hold about you. This enables you to have any incomplete or inaccurate information we hold about you corrected.
- **Request erasure** of your personal information. This enables you to ask us to delete or remove personal information where there is no good reason for us continuing to process it. You also have the right to ask us to delete or remove your personal information where you have exercised your right to object to processing (see below).
- **Object to processing** of your personal information where we are relying on a legitimate interest (or those of a third party) and there is something about your particular situation which makes you want to object to processing on this ground. You also have the right to object where we are processing your personal information for direct marketing purposes.
- **Request the restriction of processing** of your personal information. This enables you to ask us to suspend the processing of personal information about you, for example if you want us to establish its accuracy or the reason for processing it.
- **Request the transfer** of your personal information to another party.
- If you want to review, verify, correct or request erasure of your personal information, object to the processing of your personal data, or request that we transfer a copy of your personal information to another party, please do not hesitate to contact us.
- **Right to withdraw consent**
- If you have provided us with a consent to use your personal data you have a right to withdraw that consent easily at any time. Withdrawing a consent will not affect the lawfulness of our use of your personal data in reliance on that consent before it was withdrawn.

Data protection officer

We have a designated Data Protection Officer (DPO) to oversee compliance with this Privacy Notice.
