ALL ADJECTIVES ARE DESCRIBING WORDS, BUT NOT ALL DESCRIBING WORDS ARE ADJECTIVES.

ADVENTUROUS, BRIGHT, HAPPY AND SLEEPY ARE ADJECTIVES.

ADJECTIVES

GERUNDS

A GERUND IS A WORD THAT IS DERIVED FROM A VERB, BUT FUNCTIONS AS A NOUN. IN ENGLISH, GERUNDS END IN 'ING'.

GERUNDS CAN BE DESCRIBING WORDS AS WE USE THEM TO DESCRIBE ACTIONS.

EATING, JOKING, SWIMMING AND WRITING ARE GERUNDS.

AN ADVERB IS A WORD, OR PHRASE, THAT MODIFIES OR QUALIFIES AN ADJECTIVE, VERB, WORD GROUP OR OTHER ADVERB.

WE USE ADVERBS TO DESCRIBE CONCEPTS SUCH AS TIME, PLACE, CIRCUMSTANCE, MANNER OR DEGREE.

QUICKLY, SERIOUSLY, BRAVELY AND GREEDILY ARE ADVERBS.
