## EQUALITY – THE UPS AND DOWNS

### Instructions for Snakes and Ladders game

1 Throw the dice and move your counter forward the correct number of squares. If you throw a "6" you can throw again.



2 If you come to a **ladder** – move up it!



Each ladder has information about a particular piece of **law** in Northern Ireland that is trying to **stop discrimination**.

If you go up a ladder – keep a note of the law . . . it may help you later in the game.

3 If you come to a **snake** – slide down it!

Each snake gives an **example** of **discrimination** happening in our society.

If you have already been up a ladder which has a law against this type of discrimination – then you don't have to slide down the snake . . . you can keep going!

4 The winner is the first person to get to the end of the game (or the person who has travelled the furthest when your time is up).
