

Problem

Ellie is making six pancakes with **ingredients she has in her house**, using her mum's recipe.





She wants to find out how much it will cost, and if it would be cheaper to buy the pancakes rather than to make them.

It **costs £1.10** to buy a packet of **six pancakes in her local shop**.

The ingredients for **her mum's recipe** are as follows:

- 100 g plain flour
- 2 eggs
- 250 ml of semi-skimmed milk
- 1 tablespoon of sunflower oil and a pinch of salt.

Below is the cost of the ingredients:

<p>Plain flour: 80 p for a 500 g bag</p> 	<p>Eggs: Free-range eggs cost 15p each.</p> 
<p>Milk: 1 litre for 84 p 1 litre = 1000 ml</p> 	<p>Sunflower oil and salt: Her mum says that the 15 ml of oil will only be 5p.</p>  <p>She tells Ellie to ignore the cost of the salt, as it is so small.</p>

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Is it cheaper for Ellie to make or buy the pancakes?
