Breakfast: Tea and Toast

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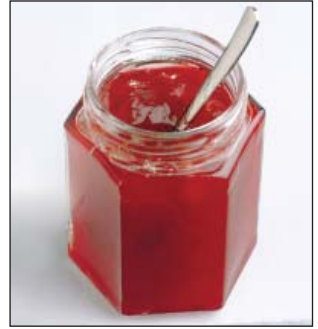
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To make tea and toast for one person, you will need these ingredients:

- a tea bag
- milk
- bread
- butter
- jam or marmalade.



You will also need this equipment:

- a cooker ring
- a teaspoon
- a teapot
- a kettle
- a toaster
- a plate
- a knife.



Step 1

Fill the kettle with cold water from the tap.
Make sure you don't overfill the kettle!
Switch it on.



Step 2

Place one tea bag in the teapot. Put the teapot near the kettle.



Step 3

When the water boils, half fill the teapot with water.



Step 4

Set the teapot on the cooker ring, and turn the ring on to a low heat.



Step 5

Put a slice of bread in the toaster and switch the toaster on.



Step 6

Carefully lift the hot toast onto a plate. Use a knife to butter it and add jam or marmalade. Cut the toast in half.



Step 7

Pour tea into the cup. Add milk to taste and stir.
